The Class Scheduling Dashboard in Tableau is a filterable view of classes scheduled in classrooms.

LOCATION____

Go to tableau.byu.edu


- Log in with your BYU net ID and password
- Choose Class Scheduling
- Click General Dashboard
- Then open Class Scheduling Dashboards

There are 2 layouts to select from. They have the same information and filters; the difference is in the layout of the days of the week. The title explains which order the days are shown in each view. Click on whichever view you prefer.

FILTERS___


The filters on the right side drive the results displayed.

- Note: Checking Null in the Preference College and Preference Priority Level filters will pull in all rooms that Academic Scheduling does not give priority in. Ex: Labs, seminar rooms, etc. that are not A or B scheduling type rooms.
- Tip for **Room Capacity** filter You can drag the half circles to narrow the search or you can click on the numbers and type in the range.



NAVIGATION____


- Use the **Undo** button to go back one step.
- Use the **Revert** button to wipe out all the filters that you've set and restart with the original data.
- Note: Data refreshes overnight, so any changes in AIM won't reflect in Tableau until the next day.

If you see a box that says **Multiple**:

• Click the box and the classes that are either Taught Together or in Conflict will display below:



- Click on the class (or any of the information on the line) to open that specific class in CLS10. If it doesn't open, check your pop-up blocker.
- To deselect a highlighted box, click in any empty cell within the time table.
