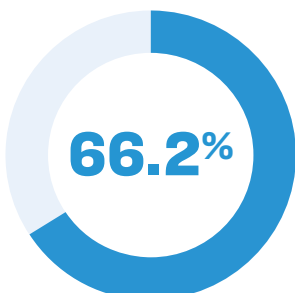

Test Optional (ACT/SAT)

- Most applicants will not be required to submit a standardized test score to be considered for admission to BYU for Spring, Summer, Fall 2023 and Winter 2024. See testoptional.byu.edu.
- If students wish to apply with a standardized test score, BYU must have an official score at the time they submit their application.
- BYU does not accept super-scores. We use the test with the highest composite score.

Transcripts

All students will need to self-report their classes and grades exactly as they appear on their official high school transcript.

- Once admitted, students will be required to submit a copy of their official high school transcript to BYU.



- If students have received any college credit, they must report it on the college section of the application and may need to submit an official transcript from the issuing college.
- Applicants with international/non-U.S. accredited work will require a credential evaluation from one of BYU's approved credential evaluators. Details at inteval.byu.edu.

Parts of the BYU Application

- Each applicant should be prepared to answer five essay questions. (See the prompts at essays.byu.edu).
- Students will choose two activities to write about.
- Members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints will complete the Ecclesiastical Endorsement with their local bishop and a member of the stake presidency. Applicants of other faiths will meet with a Latter-day Saint bishop or their own ecclesiastical leader, and the BYU Chaplain.
- Students must provide email addresses for recommendations from people who know them well. The application will email the recommender a specific recommendation form. We do not accept letters outside of the application.
 - Their current seminary teacher, if applicable.
 - A high school teacher of their choice from junior or senior year core classes - math, science, or English.
 - Any other non-family member.

- All applicants should complete the FAFSA at fafsa.gov and the BYU general scholarship application (scholarships.byu.edu).
- Pell-eligible freshmen who apply as a high school senior may qualify for full tuition for four years! Read more at cougarpellpromise.byu.edu.

- Approximately 60% of incoming freshmen received a form of financial aid in the last five years.
