

# Paying for College



## ✓ Federal Financial Aid (FAFSA)

Fill out the FAFSA to be considered for a Pell Grant and student loans. Fill it out early to avoid delays. Remember to reapply every year.

## ✓ BYU Scholarships

Students must apply each year for BYU scholarships. The application is available in September, and must be submitted by January 2. Student scholarships include academic (based on BYU GPA), need-based (must fill out the FAFSA by January 2), and private scholarships.

## ✓ Other Scholarships

BYU department scholarships may be available. See your department or advisement center for details. Also check for private scholarships using various free online search engines.

## ✓ Employment, Savings, Parents

Use your personal savings or ask family members to help pay for school. Many employment opportunities are also available on campus. Pay typically ranges from \$10-14/hr with a limit of working 20 hours a week, so you can focus on being a student.
